

First Column

SIS REPORT

- 1. **TOEFL:** Required score for undergraduate university admission.
- 2. ESL: English as a Second Language program; no TOEFL score required, but in most cases, competition won't be possible while learning English.
- 3. Pathway: Program that requires a certain level of TOEFL in English and provides access to university credits, allowing for competition.
- 4. **SAT:** Exam for NCAA university admission; exceptions may apply, and it can help secure additional academic funding.
- 5. Books and Insurance not included: This cost is not covered because it varies from university to university.
- 6. Negotiable: A scholarship that can still be improved and negotiated further.
- 7. No practice or competition allowed: During the English learning period, especially in ESL programs, training and competition are not permitted.
- 8. Training depends on University Decision: The university will decide whether training or competition is allowed during this period.
- 9. **Athletic Scholarship:** Scholarship for the university's first team.

- 10. Must Try out: Participants must undergo preseason training or a trial to determine placement on the first or second team.
- 11. **Academic Scholarship:** Academic-based scholarship.
- 12. **GPA:** Grade point average.
- 13. **Scholarship depends on profile:** The scholarship depends on factors such as GPA, TOEFL scores, and other admission criteria.
- 14. Living off-campus cost: This scholarship covers tuition but not accommodation and meals. However, the coach or university will assist in finding an apartment near campus with other students.

Color Legend

Green: Athletic scholarship for the first team (if the student is an athlete).

Blue: ESL scholarship.

Yellow: Academic scholarship.

White: Athletic or academic scholarship with possibilities to join the first or

second team.

Orange: Master's scholarship.

Light Green: Priority player at SIS Soccer Academy.
